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Course Description


English 10 is a yearlong course designed to reinforce those advanced composition skills taught in English 9 and meets the Common Core requirements. Literary analysis of fiction and nonfiction works, poetry, short stories and novels will be taught in conjunction with course text. Students will also review literary devices to prepare for the CAHSEE. English 10 also focuses on vocabulary enrichment, public speaking principles, grammar review, research techniques and so forth. Students will be expected to write often both at home and in the classroom. Students will also be required to read one or two novels outside of class each semester. This is a writing intensive course.

Attendance Policy

You must be at your desk, working in your journal, when the bell rings or you will receive lunch detention. When absent, it is your responsibility to locate and complete missed assignments and exams. You must check Google Classroom, the class calendar and/or the class website before asking for missing assignments. Never return to class and ask, "What did I miss?".

- Students will have the number of days absent plus one day to make up missed work IF the absence is excused.
- Late work, as the result of negligence, will not be accepted..
- All long-term assignments and projects must be handed in on the assigned due date even if the student is absent from class. He or she is responsible for insuring that work is submitted to the teacher's mailbox, online or through another student.
- In addition, all tests and quizzes missed during an absence must be made up within one week of returning to class. It is the student's responsibility to arrange for a make-up within this time frame. After one week, the test or quiz will receive a zero.
